Fire Safe Occidental

Purpose:

- Enable all members of the community to raise alerts quickly if:
 - A fire starts in a neighborhood that might
 - Affect access
 - Spread quickly
 - Another emergency situation arises
 - e.g., Tree down blocking access
 - Neighbor in need of aid

Call Hierarchy

- Neighborhood Member - can call all members of neighborhood
- Neighborhood Leader – can call all Neighborhood Leaders
- Steering Committee Members – can call all members of all neighborhoods

Scenario One

Neighborhood member spots a structure and vegetation fire west of Occidental Motel on a windy day threatens to blow into town, block Bittner and create problems on two of the potential evacuation routes, Bittner and Bohemian Hwy.

- Neighborhood 13 Member Action: **Call 911** then call One Call Now and send a message to the neighborhood alerting them
- Neighborhood Leader(s) Action: Using available information, decide if other neighborhood leaders need to be alerted
 - If yes: Call One Call Now and send message to Neighborhood Leaders
 - If no: continue to monitor the situation
- Steering Committee Member Action: When notified, communicate with other available SC members, evaluate whether further action is needed
 - If yes: Send One Call Now message to all contacts in community
 - If no: continue to monitor the situation

Scenario Two

You are doing a controlled burn, the wind kicks up suddenly and it gets out of hand.

- Neighborhood Member Action: **Call 911** then call One Call Now and send a message to the neighborhood alerting them
- Neighborhood Leader(s) Action: Using available information, decide if other neighborhood leaders need to be alerted
 - If yes: Call One Call Now and send message to Neighborhood Leaders
 - If no: continue to monitor the situation
- Steering Committee Member Action: When notified, communicate with other available SC members, evaluate whether further action is needed
 - If yes: Send One Call Now message to all contacts in community
 - If no: continue to monitor the situation

Calling Access Diagram 1

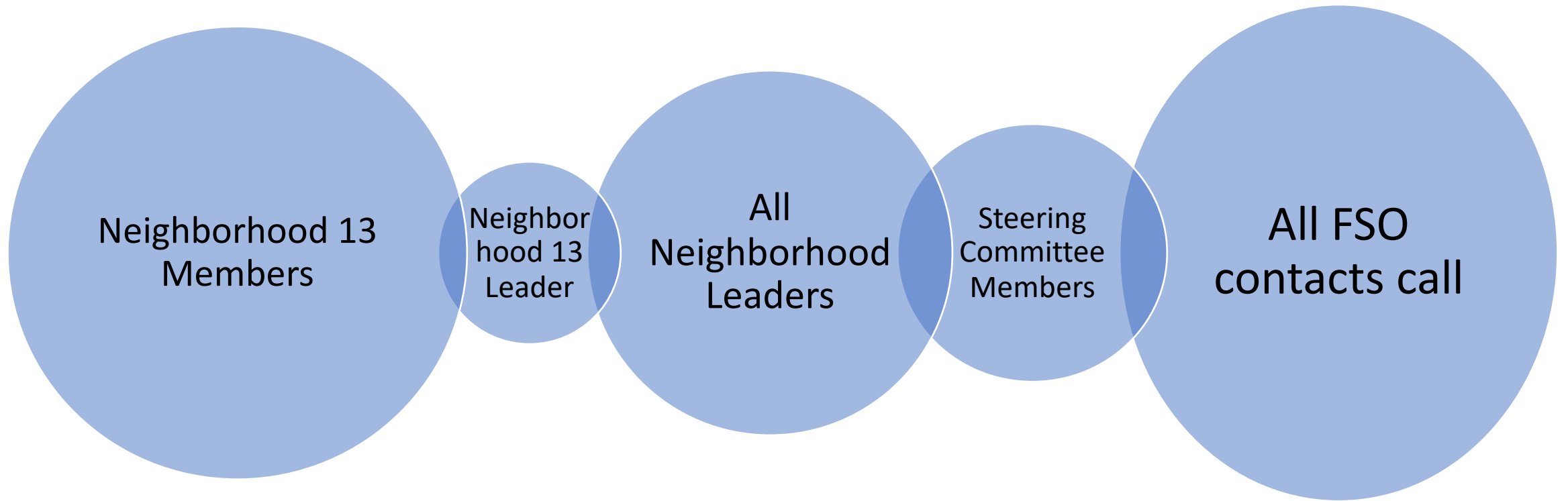


Steering Committee can call all SC members,
all Neighborhood Leaders
and **ALL** contacts

Neighborhood Leaders can call all
their own neighborhood contacts
and all Neighborhood Leaders

Neighborhood Members can call
all neighborhood contacts

Call Access Diagram 2

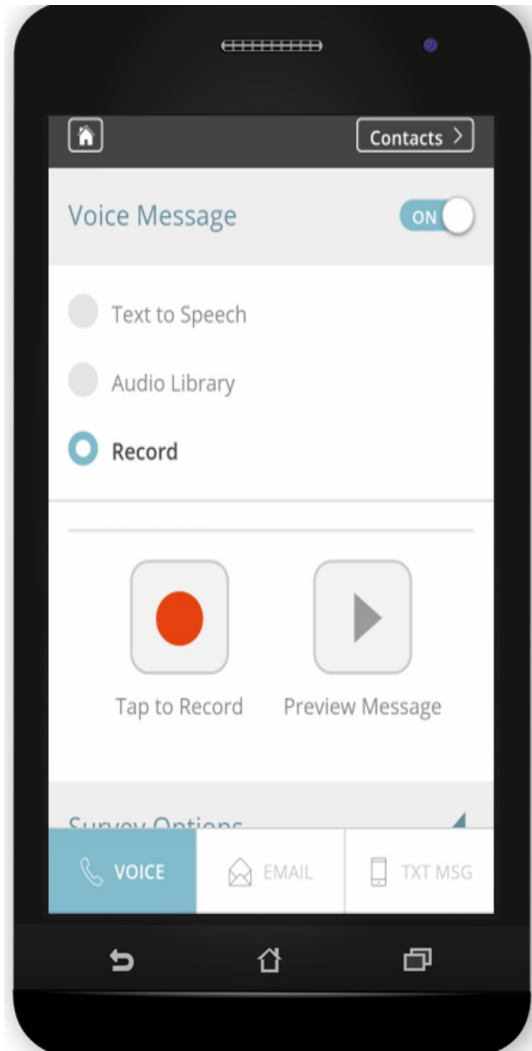


To Send a Message via Phone

1. Access your One Call Now account on your phone by dialing 1-877-698-3261
2. Press **Pound #** followed by your **Group ID** and **PIN**
3. Press **1** to record and send a message to your Group
4. At the tone, record your message.
Press **#** immediately after you've finished speaking to end your recording.
Listen to your message to make sure it's clear and complete
Press 1 to accept
Press 2 to re-record it
5. Press 00 to send your message to the entire group.
6. Press **#** and follow the remaining prompts to send the message.
Press **00** to send your message to the **entire** group.

Important: Do not hang up until you hear "Message delivery has been confirmed," otherwise, your message may not be delivered.

Sending a Voice Message on the One Call Now App



On the Dashboard, tap **Create a New Message**. The **Create a New Message** screen displays.

At the bottom of the screen, tap **VOICE**. The **Voice Message** screen displays.

Tap the **OFF** switch so that **ON** displays as shown.

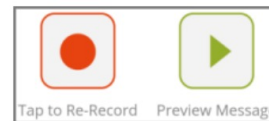
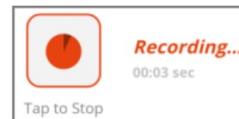
Tap **Record**.

Tap the **Tap to Record** button.

Tap the **Tap to Stop** button.

Tap the **Preview Message** button to listen to the message.

Tap **Contacts** and continue with the send a message process.



To re-record the message, tap the **Tap to Re-record** button.

When to Call

- It is important that we use this system effectively
 - we don't want to "Cry Wolf"
 - we don't want to increase anxiety unnecessarily
 - we DO want people to know when potential danger is present in their location
 - we DO want people to respond immediately
- Messages should be sent when KNOWN danger is present
 - not when you smell smoke and are wondering what is happening
 - definitely when you KNOW there is a wildfire in your neighborhood on a windy dry day
- Each of us will have to use our best judgment, it is our greatest resource
